Centennial Celebration Show

Saturday, July 31

What: The Greater Cleveland Council invites all local Scouts, alumni and residents to join in a celebration of the Boy Scouts of America’s 100th Anniversary and watch the first-ever broadcast of the Centennial Celebration Show from the 2010 National Scout Jamboree. The Jamboree is being held at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia and attracts more than 40,000 Scouts and Scouting volunteers from across the country.

The event marks the first time in BSA history that the entire Scouting community—past, present, and future—will have the opportunity to join together to experience an inspirational and interactive Jamboree arena show, which will be broadcast via satellite to select locations nationwide.
